M-Step Testing

The month of April is the time of year when we administer the Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress (M-STEP) to all students in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades. This is our school's summative assessments designed to measure student growth.

English Language Arts and Mathematics are assessed in grades 3–5, Science and Social Studies in grade 5. This test will be taken online, utilizing our Chromebooks and computer lab.

Students will not be testing everyday, and tests in each area will take between one and two hours.

Please make sure your child attends regularly throughout the month of April



to ensure an opportunity to take this assessment.

Beyond just academics, ensuring your child gets proper rest is key to their success during this testing period. Adequate sleep not only enhances cognitive function but also boosts memory retention and problem-solving abilities, all crucial elements for excelling on the M-STEP.

Houghton Portage Township Schools has begun registering Kindergarten-aged children for the 2025-2026 school year.

Children who will be five years of age by December 1st, 2025, are eligible to enter Kindergarten or Young 5's.

Children currently attending Young 5's are automatically registered for kindergarten.
