The Positivity Project

At Houghton Elementary, we're proud to continue our work with The Positivity Project, a school-wide initiative that helps students build strong relationships and character. Each week, students explore different character strengths that support their social and emotional growth.

This month, our focus will be on two important traits: Bravery and Gratitude.

- Bravery is about facing challenges even when it's difficult. Whether it's standing up for what's right, trying something new, or working through tough emotions, we're helping students recognize that courage doesn't mean being fearless—it means doing the right thing even when you are afraid.
- Gratitude encourages students to recognize and appreciate the good in their lives. Whether it's a kind friend, a caring teacher, or simply a sunny day, we want students to notice and express thanks for the positives—big and small.

Stay Healthy, Gremlins!

As we head into flu season, we ask families to help keep our school community healthy. Please keep your child home if they have:

- A fever of 100°F or higher (must be fever-free for 24 hours without medication before returning)
- Vomiting or diarrhea within the last 24 hours
- · Severe sore throat, cough, or difficulty breathing
- · Red, irritated, or painful eyes with discharge
- · An undiagnosed or spreading rash

Encouraging rest and recovery helps prevent the spread of illness and ensures your child returns to school healthy and ready to learn. Thank you for your support!

Services include physical exams, sick care, treatment for acute and chronic illnesses, immunizations, rapid flu and strep testing, overthe-counter medications, health education, and referrals for specialty care.

Parents can bring their child to the Wellness Center, just like the a walk-in clinic, if they go home sick from school. Using the center helps students stay healthy, recovery quickly, and return to school sooner ready to learn.
